***CERTIFICATE OF RECOGNITION IN INSTRUMENTAL PERFORMANCE***

The Certificate of Recognition in Instrumental Performance program is offered for instrumental students (guitar, strings, winds/brass/percussion). The purpose of the program and recognition certificate is to provide instrumental music majors outside the performance concentration the opportunity to demonstrate performance skills and ability beyond the requirements of their degree.

Eligibility and Criteria

Instrumental students enrolled in either the Bachelor of Music degree (non-performance concentrations) or the Bachelor of Arts in Music degree may apply for entry into the performance recognition program at any time after three semesters of private lessons at UTSA. Students must be enrolled in MUS 2542 or higher levels of applied instruction during the semester of application. During the semester of application the student must play and pass an extended jury to be admitted to the performance recognition program.

Once admitted to the performance recognition program, and with the consent of their music faculty advisor and area coordinators, students will enroll in MUS 3543 during the semester of the performance recognition recital. The performance recognition recital will be one hour in length and may satisfy the requirement of the student's proficiency recital. The performance recognition recital should be representative of a senior-level performance recital and must include a chamber work. The student will assume the cost and contracting responsibilities for their accompanist. A three-member faculty panel representing at least two areas will adjudicate the recital. Students who successfully pass the recital will receive the Certificate of Recognition in Music Performance.
